Dear Parent/Carer

As part of the A level Geography course, students are required to undertake fieldwork activities in preparation for the Non Examined Assessment, which is a piece of coursework worth 25%.

In order to give students the best opportunities in which to complete this coursework, we will be taking the current Year 12 group to Liverpool and Formby, to allow them to participate in primary data collection and consolidate their understanding of coastal landforms and processes and regenerating places. Whilst we are on the trip we will be carrying out fieldwork at various places in the local area, including Formby, Southport and Liverpool city centre. This will allow students to choose an appropriate title for the NEA and complete their data collection, as well as write up part of their coursework.

We will be leaving school on Monday 18 July at approximately 9.00am and will be returning on Wednesday 20 July at approximately 6.00pm (times to be confirmed). We will be staying at the Liverpool Central Youth Hostel Private ensuite rooms. All food is included during the duration of our stay at the accommodation or in the local area. Students will need to bring a packed lunch for the first day for lunch. They might also want to bring some money to buy food on Wednesday whilst we are travelling home.

As the weather will probably be very unpredictable, students need to ensure that they have the correct clothing for the trip. They will need a waterproof coat and trousers, trainers, several layers of clothing and sun cream and sun hat if required. They will also need to bring a towel and toiletries and a change of clothes to wear at the Youth Hostel. Bedding is provided. They will be working in the evenings in the Youth Hostel so that we can make the most of our time in order to work on the coursework.

The cost of the trip is £100 which includes transport, accommodation and food. Please pay via ParentPay by Wednesday 6 July 2022.
